September Meeting

- Alan Sisco, Director of Special Projects at the COG, led an open discussion about making our region more competitive for grant and development opportunities that address real and specific needs of our member boroughs. Managers identified needs such as: Zoning/codification updates, community centers, trails and parks, riverfront development, blight demolition, road and sewer improvements, and affordable housing. Barriers to seeking grant funds and other development opportunities include: inability to meet a local match, time and manpower to find and apply for funding. Suggested next steps: Invite managers to meetings centered around specific topics, conduct online meetings to make attendance easier. There is a concrete benefit in collaborating with neighboring boroughs. Please contact Alan with more suggestions.

Lead Service Line Replacement Program

PA American Water has launched a state-wide initiative to locate and replace all lead and galvanized metal water pipes, even those privately owned. at NO COST to homeowners and businesses. What's the catch? There isn't one. Lead in our drinking water is an ongoing public health hazard, and eliminating it benefits us all. You can help by **sharing this message** with your residents and encouraging them to contact PA American Water. Some homeowners are reluctant to let strangers into their homes for pipe inspection. Outreach from the Borough Offices can reassure them and help eliminate the risk of lead poisoning.

For more information, visit PA American Water's <u>Frequently Asked Questions</u>, and their <u>interactive map.</u> Type in an address and see, based on the data collected so far, the composition of water pipes in each specific structure. PAAW needs more residents to contact them, update this data, allow pipes to be inspected, and get hazardous ones replaced. Please consider making this a priority in your borough.

GRANT APPLICATIONS CURRENTLY OPEN

MORE - Municipal Opportunities for Retrofits and Energy Efficiency Grant Program (PEDA) application deadline October 25

MORE offers grants and loans to deploy energy efficiency and renewable energy projects in federally owned buildings and facilities. Glassport is currently completing an application for this grant.

Active Allegheny Grant Program (ACED) application deadline November 8

AAGP provides funds for planning and designing transportation projects that provide opportunities for connectivity and physical activity. The City of Duquesne is currently working on an application for this grant.

Main Street Matters Program (DCED) application deadline November 15

MSM funds revitalization of downtown cores and surrounding neighborhoods - planning, supporting small businesses, public safety enhancements, and more.
